

Fayette County Comprehensive Transportation Plan



Round 1 Public Input Summary

The first round of public engagement activities for the Fayette County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Update took place during the week of May 10th and included a public meeting on Tuesday, May 12 and a series of community events throughout the County the following Saturday, May 16. In addition, an online map activity and survey was open to the public from April 14 to May 31.

What We Heard

Key Themes:

- There is desire for new **multi-modal connections**, particularly for golf-carts.
- **Traffic congestion** - particularly along SR 74 at SR 54 and SR 74 at SR 85 - is a major concern amongst residents.
- **Safety** where local roads and state routes meet, particularly where SR 85 meets the SR 85 Connector, is paramount.
- **Redwine Road** - new golf cart, bike, or pedestrian connections along road.
- **Roundabouts** have been well received, and people would like to see more.

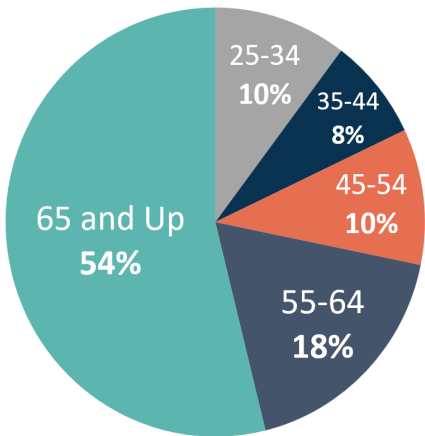

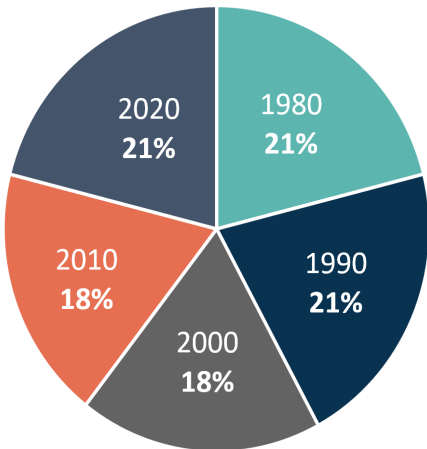

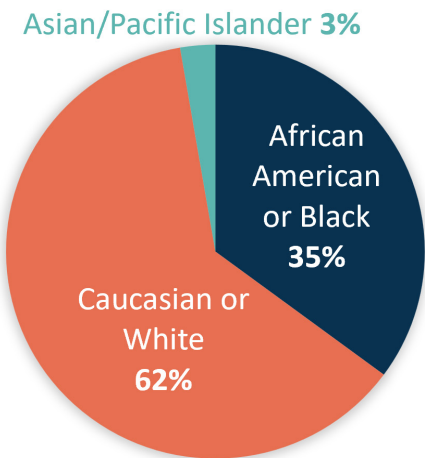

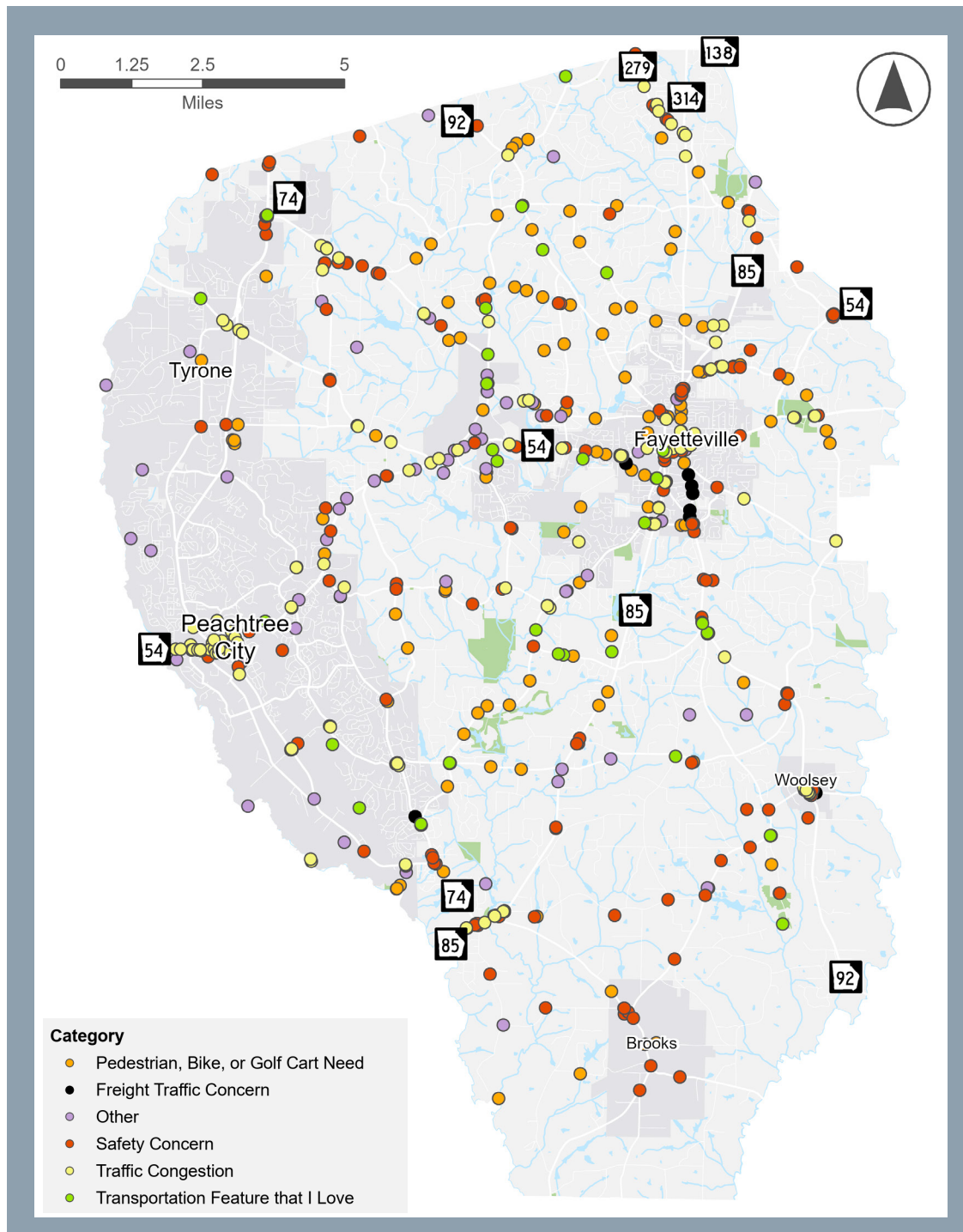

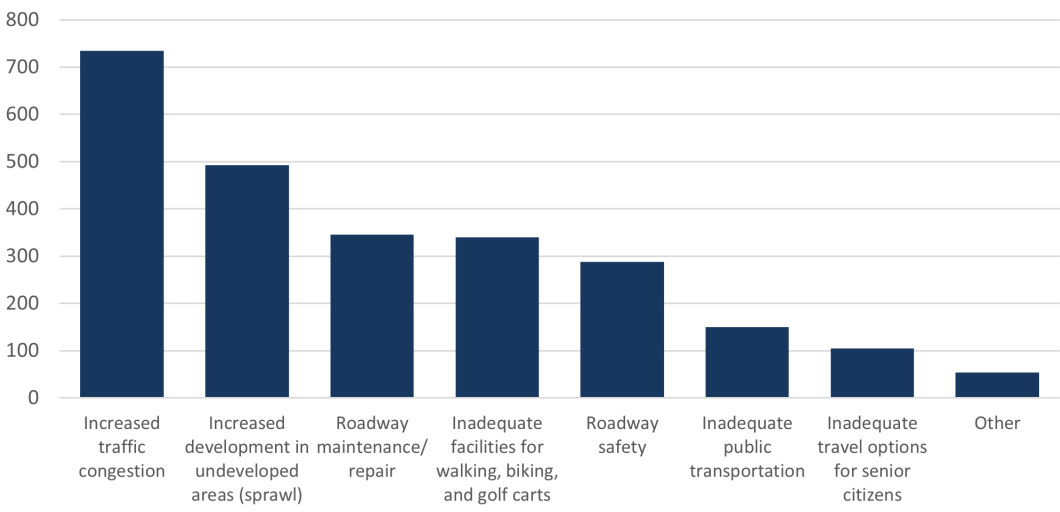

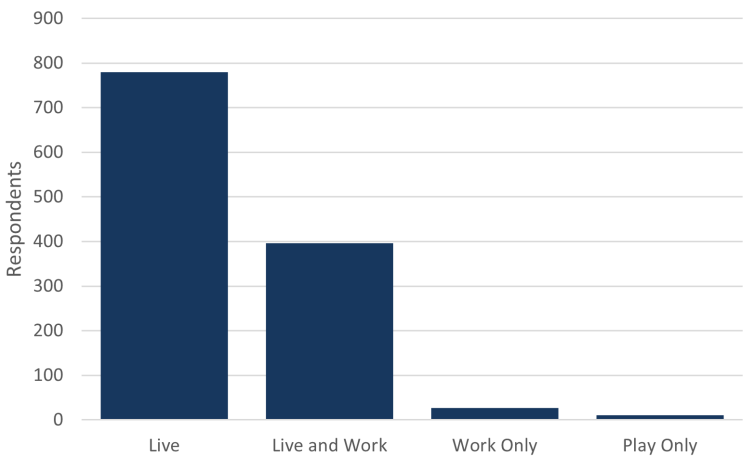
Online Survey Results

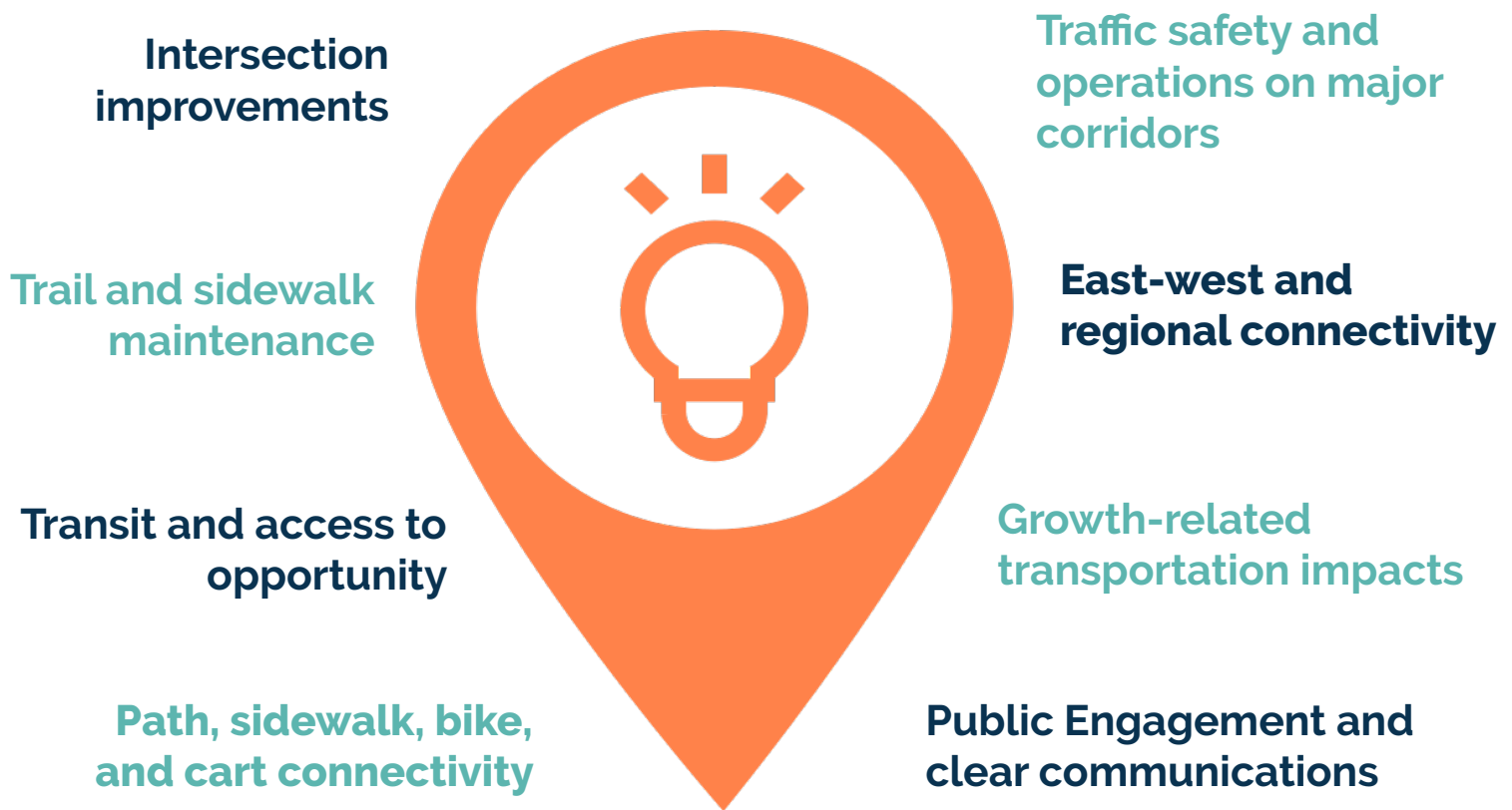
